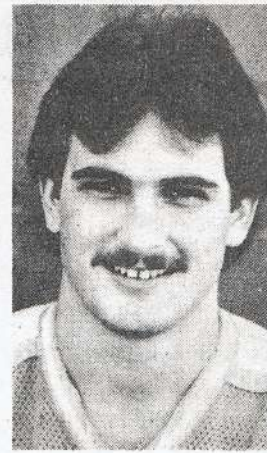
The coaching change earlier in the season that saw Mike Enemark leave the scene for a short stint didn't affect the team at all, and if

REVELSTOKE RANGERS

The Rangers have had their troubles over the season but it has not deterred their head coach and General Manager, Murray Lawrence in any way from going full speed for the playoffs.

In past seasons this ability to steer his team, regardless of the status at the beginning of the season, into a team capable of going the distance has been a trade mark. This year is no different.

It has taken a few shifty trades, some quick footwork and some excellent coaching, but the tide has risen in the coaches favour, and the Rangers look as if they will be heading into the playoffs either in third or fourth spot.

In order for Murray Lawrence to have a little more time to work on the squads management duties, a newcomer will be stepping into the void that Murray is opening up, **Bernie Cole**, at the moment coming in as an assistant coach.

Chances are that fans of the ERangers will be seeing **Bernie** taking over the bench duties from Murray in the near future.

PENTICTON KNIGHTS

There is little doubt in the minds of those who attend the Knights games that this is the power of the Interior division.

The team has been accused at times of living in another world, some hockey planet light years removed from this world, but actually it is only the excellent coaching and scouting that makes

the difference.

Without that kind of work going on all the time, how could a team come up constantly with the calibre of player this one does, youngsters such as All Star **Joe Murphy** to name the latest in a long line of stars.
