



Corky Agar Will Try Local Hockey

Corky Agar, son of former Vernon Canadians coach, George Agar, has returned to Vernon to attend school and play hockey.

Sixteen-year-old Corky will enter grade 11 at Vernon High School in the fall. He will stay with Mr. and Mrs. Roy Eastwood.

His main interest in Vernon will be the Junior Hockey team, his prime reason for coming to town. The idea, partly his and partly his father's, will see Corky trying out for a centre slot on the local team this fall.

In a Californian League last year for 16-18 year olds Corky scored 15 goals in 10 games. He says the league would be equivalent to our local Juvenile league.

He told The Vernon News it is surprising how much of a minor hockey setup there is in California.

He also said he doesn't think there is much difference in the schools.

The biggest difference he cited was the teachers' dress. "When it's hot the teachers dress casually," he said. "It's sometimes hard to tell the teachers from the students."
