

Kelowna's Don White Named OMJHL Prexy

Kelowna's Don White was yesterday elected president of the Okanagan-Mainline Junior Hockey Association for the 1962-63 season at the association's annual general meeting held here.

White replaced Bill Brown of Vernon who held the post during the somewhat turbulent but successful first season.

Brown steps into the executive position of past president with Mike Shabaga of Kamloops being elected vice-president.

The meeting also voted a change in the constitution to provide for a second vice-president who will be elected at a later date.

Penticton, not represented at the meeting, cast their ballots by telephone.

Following election of officers,

the meeting moved to recommend the re-appointment of Vernon's Len Miller as secretary-treasurer.

Miller is also expected to handle the duties of league statistician next season, a job which was left uncompleted halfway through the 1961-62 term.

However, final statistics are expected to be released soon with the league scoring champion and OMJHL most valuable player to be announced.
