Sunday Meeting To Decide Future Course Of OJHL

Whither junior hockey? That's the "must" question the Okanagan Junior Hockey League executive sets out to answer at a special league meeting here Sunday.

First off the league will deal with the status of the Penticton Junior Vees. The Penticton club has been plagued since its inception with poor support financially and organizationally and unless it has these problems resolved by Sunday it may be forced to fold.

Waiting in the wings to take the Vees' place should they quit the league are two Cariboo clubs, Williams Lake and Quesnel, and the OJHL may decide to accept them on an interlocking basis if this occurs.

The league will also be attempting to iron out another prickly problem—player importation. Each club will submit its recommendations for or against such a policy and together formulate a hard and fast rule to insert in the league constitution.

New OJHL president Len Miller of Vernon will chair Sunday's important meeting which will be held in the Allison Hotel.
