

Junior Puck Schedule Now Being Drafted

The schedule for the 1963-64 Okanagan Junior "A" Hockey League season may soon be out.

At a meeting of the OJHL held here Sunday league president Len Miller said he was drawing up a rough draft of a schedule which the league executive will ratify at another meeting next Monday.

Scheduling will be more difficult this year with only three teams in the OJHL. A 36-game schedule is planned running through to the middle of February.

The executive unanimously supported a resolution to be submitted by Kamloops Rocket manager Don Brown at the forthcoming B.C. Amateur Hockey Association meeting in Kelowna. It calls for a curb in the present practice of prairie teams drawing prospective players out of B.C. by setting a charge of between \$750 and \$1,000 for each player taken out of the province, the money to go to the minor hockey association that developed the player.

It was felt this would discourage indiscriminate recruiting of prospective players, considered detrimental to junior hockey in B.C.
