

OJHL Fails To Fix Playoff Schedule At Meeting Here

A cut-and-dried schedule for the forthcoming Okanagan Junior "A" Hockey League playoff next month hasn't been decided upon and it likely won't be in black and white for at least another week.

A meeting of the OJHL executive held here in Vernon Sunday failed to settle the matter conclusively and so another meeting was set for Monday, January 20 at which time a schedule will be drafted. Final drafting of the schedule is pending a meeting of the Junior Hockey Branch of the BCAHA when the provincial playoff schedule for the four leagues concerned will be drawn up.

The OJHL playoff, when drafted, will most likely be a round robin affair with the team finishing with the most points being declared the winner.

The referees' "strike" in Kelowna was also discussed at Sunday's meeting but no action was taken or contemplated by the league. The matter will be brought up again at next Monday's meeting when the referee-in-chief, who was unable to attend Sunday, will be present.
