

Rockets Adding Six From OJHL For Playoff

The newly crowned B.C. junior hockey champion Kamloops Rockets will be adding six players to their roster for their up-and-coming B.C. - Alberta Memorial Cup playoff series with Edmonton Oil Kings.

This is in compliance with demands by the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association for the Rockets to strengthen its ranks for the inter-provincial series.

Rocket coach Kenny Stewart has asked three players each from Vernon Blades and Kelowna Buckaroos to try out with the club in a practice this week.

From Vernon, Stewart has invited defencemen Gordie Nuyens and Jim Stephen and centre Bobby Stein; from Kelowna he has asked right wing-
