

Four Teams In OJHL With Penticton-S'land Entrance

The Okanagan Junior "A" Hockey League will be back to four teams again next season.

OJHL president Len Miller announced on the weekend that he had received an application from a combined Penticton-Summerland junior club for entry into the league along with the required \$100 deposit.

George Stoll of Summerland well-known in Valley hockey circles, is general manager of the prospective team which will include junior hockey players from both Summerland and Penticton.

Preliminary arrange-

ments for entry have already been made in Penticton with respect to ice times. John Coe, chairman of the Penticton Parks Board, has informed Stoll that Friday nights will definitely be available in the Penticton arena.

Stoll is making further arrangements in Summerland and is expected to supply the league with more definite information on the club in the near future.

"The addition of a fourth team to the league should not only help schedule arrangements but boost the calibre of hockey as well," said president Miller in announcing the application.
