

# Those Wacky, Wacky Blades! Belt Bucks With 10 Players

## Diehard Jrs. Carry Series Lead Into Clash Tonight

VERNON 5, KELOWNA 2

There's strength in numbers, the old saying goes, but whoever coined that phrase certainly didn't reckon on Vernon Blades gumming up the works.

Friday night the Blades buried this time-worn maxim in the ashcan with one of the craziest reversals of Fate you'd care to see.

The Blades, icing only ten players (nine of which are full-time regulars), soundly whipped a fat, healthy and supposedly impregnable 15-man squad of Kelowna Buckaroos 5-2 in the Orchard City to take a 2-1 lead in their best of seven Okanagan Junior "A" Hockey League semi-final playoff series.


It was improbable enough that the Blades beat the Buckaroos with the meagre forces at their disposal but to defeat them on their home ice was positively incredible.

But beat them they did and so convincingly that the Blades are favored to pull a repeat act here tonight at Vernon Civic Arena and take a 3-1 strangle hold on the series. Game time is 8:30 p.m. and a record crowd, swelled by the current Winter Carnival, is expected for the crucial clash.

Elsewhere in the OJHL the underdogs were winning too on the weekend. Down in Penticton Friday night the Penticton - Summerland Broncos galloped over Kamloops Rockets 5-3 to lead their semi-final three games to two.

Kamloops has the last two games of the best of seven series but they are faced with winning both of them to make the finals.

Vernon coach Hap Schaefer must have had a king-sized migraine in looking over his roster prior to Friday's game. It looked like the remnants of World War Two suicide squad.

He only had (get this!) one serviceable defenceman, captain Jim Stephen. This disastrous state of affairs was brought about by the sudden and completely unaccountable departure of Gary Koski to his home in Saskatchewan and the failure of Dave Mackay to make it up from UBC for the weekend game.

Schaefer was almost left with just six forwards but fortunately enough Marvin Maier and Ron Penno, who had been off on a jaunt to the Coast, made it back in time.

So, with ten players to carry the load, the Blades advanced into battle against the Fearsome Fifteen of Kelowna. The result is still fantastic to grasp.

Playing their most inspired and determined hockey of the season the Blades spotted the Buckaroos an early 2-0 first

period lead, then bounced back with five unanswered goals, one in the first and two each in the second and third, to send a 1,000-plus Kelowna crowd right around the bend in stunned disbelief.

Bobby Stein led the way with three goals while adding singletons were Dale Sorochuk and Ralph Litzenberger, Gordie Schnepf and Warde Dayle clicked for Kelowna.

Sorochuk filled the gaping hole on defence left by Koski and did a very creditable job, considering he has never played the position before. Stein also did duty on the blueline to back up Stephen who went the whole way as usual.

Goalie Norm Schiman was brilliant in the nets, stopping 31 Kelowna drives, many of them severe testers. Buckaroos' Mike Gaal handled 28.

There were ten penalties called by referee Dale Cassell, six to Vernon. It was a hard-hitting game but, like the two predecessors, clean throughout.

Schnepf tallied unassisted to open scoring for Kelowna at 3:10 of the first period and Dayle rifled in a Garth Rizzuto - Dave Cousins relay to put the Bucks two up.

But then, at the 13-minute mark, Stein cut loose on a breakaway to beat Gaal and launch the Blades on Operation Comeback.

At 7:24 of the second Sorochuk squared accounts with another solo effort and Mr. Hustle, Ralph Litzenberger, steered in a pass from Allan Rogan and Ike Coulter 30 seconds later for the go-ahead and eventual winning marker.

The third period was all Stein's. At 11:54 he unleashed a hard drive with Rogan on the assisting end and with less than two minutes to full time blinked the light for the third time on a fine play from Maier.

## Juveniles Start Gunning For Championship Tuesday

Vernon Juvenile All-Stars level their sights on an Okanagan - Mainline juvenile hockey championship, starting Tuesday night at 8:15 p.m. in the Civic Arena.

Should Vernon win this series as well they would gain an automatic bye into the B.C. championship finals against either the Kootenays or the Coast. This playoff is tentatively set for early March.
