

# Rival WHL Managers To Coach At Kelowna

Two well known general managers from the western hockey league will handle the coaching duties for the summer all-star hockey game slated for Kelowna arena on Saturday, August 7.

Hal Laycoe, of league champion Portland Buckaroos, will oppose Seattle's Keith Allen.

The star studded spectacular is headlined by Chicago's brilliant left winger Bobby Hull and Detroit's hard rock defenseman Bill Gadsby.

Goalkeepers for the event will be former Kelowna Packer Art Lariviere, now practice goalie and trainer for Chicago Black Hawks, while at the other end of the ice, Kelowna Buckaroos' all-star netminder Mike Gaal will be up against Mr. Hull and company.

Other big names taking part include Canada's

junior sensation Frank Huck of Regina Pats; Portland's Art Jones, Gerry Goyer and Arnie Schmautz; Vancouver's Billy McNeill, the W.H.L.'s most valuable player, Larry Lund, a Penticton boy of San Francisco Seals and Kamloops minor hockey graduate Bert Marshall, a defenseman with Memphis Wings of the Central Pro League.

Western International Hockey League rookie of the year Murray Owen of Nelson Maple Leafs and another graduate of Kamloops Minor Hockey will also be in the lineup, along with an all-star cast from the Okanagan Junior Hockey League represented by Kamloops, Vernon, Penticton and Kelowna.
