Kelowna Looks Impressive Down Vernon Blades Easily

Kelowna Buckaroos skated to an impressive 8-0 victory Thursday night over Vernon Blades before the partisan fans.

Kelowna's scoring was not hindered by Vernon's best forward, Norm MacKenzie, who with Kelowna's Al MacKenzie was called on to stop 25.

VERNA LINE PLAYING
Marcello Verna, Kelowna's small but fiery center, opened Kelowna's scoring at 4:38 of the first period. Verna took a pass from teammate John Strong and pushed the disc behind the net.

Defence John Strong made it 2-0 after taking a pass from Marcello Verna on the blue line and beating Blades' defence.

GOALS
Strong followed his second goal with a third after taking a pass from Mike Damstra at 1:38 mark of second period.

Mike Damstra scored the fourth goal of the night just 51 seconds later after being pulled into the ring by Marcello Verna.

Clare Ruzic's line got into the scoring picture at 5:28 of the second period after taking a pass from Lew Swanson.

Bill Ball, back from forward from Prince George, scored Kelowna's sixth goal at 6:16 of the second period on a trick from teammate Mike Damstra.

Kelowna's four unanswered goals at the start of the second period came in a span of 2 minutes 38 seconds.

VERNON'S FIRST
Bob Bates put Vernon on the score sheet at 8:45 of the second period. Bates broke away and beat Kelowna's goalkeeper Kammings with a clear hard shot.

Dave Couvres and Lew Swanson combined to score in the second period. Couvres counted his goal at 8:51 after passing from Bill and Mullan.

Swanson's goal came on a break away when he crashed past Vernon's goalie with a blistering shot.
