Stein-Sorochuk Figure In Statistics

The long awaited move of the Kamloops Kraft Kings upwards on the Okanagan Junior Hockey League standings has begun.

Sparked by three wins over Vernon Blades Kamloops is now in second place in the league and moving out after Kelowna, currently six points ahead of the Hub City Crew.

Needless to say, Vernon is in firm position in the league basement, mired so deeply that no one is likely to disturb their tenure.

Much of the Kamloops momentum has been gained from the outbreak of scoring by Eric Shishido and Dale Sandyke. Shishido now leads the individual stats with a booming 44 points on 15 goals and a league leading 29 assists.

Teammate Sandyke has a

loop leading 21 goals and 20 assists to remain within striking distance of

Shishido. Larry Palanio of Penticton Broncs is a distant third with 29 points. Then Vernon emerges with some of the honors as Bob Stein and Dale Sorochuk are tied

with a Kelowna player for fourth spot and 28 points.

Stein has counted 13 goals and 15 assists while Sorochuk has 12 goals and 16 assists.
