The Vernon Junior Blades lost their second game of the season Tuesday night in Kelowna but coach Odie Lowe, although he gives the 7-3 loss much thought, isn't going to worry about it too much.

"Kelowna has a strong club," says Lowe. "But the boys played better than they did Saturday night." Last Saturday night Blades lost their first Okanagan Junior Hockey League fixture to the Penticton Broncos.

Kelowna took a 1-0 lead after one period and stretched it to 5-2 after the second stanza. Brian Fisher, who paced the Bucs' attack with two goals and three assists, scored the tiebreaker at the 6:23 mark of the initial period.

Jim Broadhurst and John Strong gave Kelowna a 3-0 margin early in the middle frame but Blades pounced back with two goals to come within one of winners. Wayne Latourneau scored Blue's first goal at 12:47 in an unassisted effort and he was followed less than a minute later by Pat Hembree on an assist from centre Tom Williamson. It was Hembree's third goal in two games for Blades.


