

Make playoff splurge

Blades harness Bucks

For second win scored in a row

Two goals each by Rick Reilly and Tom Serviss and a single counter by Keith Rolston moved the Vernon Junior Blades to a 5-4 victory over Kelowna Friday evening at the Central City.

For Blades, who are destined to finish the 1966-67 season in third place, it was the second straight win. They play Wednesday night at Kamloops and then return to Civic Arena this Saturday for their final game of the regular league schedule against Penticton Broncos.

In the second game Friday, Penticton bumped Kamloops Kraft Kings 7-3 at the Peach City. And Saturday the league champions completed the rout by downing Kraft Kings at the Hub City 5-4.

Reilly, who appears to be hitting his playoff stride with the help of speeders Wayne Dye and Mike Perepolkin, both brought up

from Don Jakes' Midget All Star ranks a few games ago, scored the first and last goals of the game.

At 8:23 of the first period he got his stick on a Dye shot to catch Kelowna goalie Rex Rideout going the wrong way, and at 8:36 of the final period, he chopped a moving puck from the point into the open side of the cage.

The Vernons jumped to a 3-0 first period lead, folded in the middle session and were outscored 4-0, then added the tie-maker and the

winner within the first 10 minutes of the third period.

Serviss ripped a shot from the point for Blades second marker at 12:41 and then deked Bucks Brian Fisher out of a hockey glove at the Kelowna blueline for Blueshirts three-upmanship at 17:45.

All four Kelowna goals were scored in the middle period.

At 1:41 Fisher beat Vernon defenseman Ken Pollen in a sprint for the puck, carried on to out-race netminder Gerry Allen and flipped it behind the cageman, who recorded a shut-out in two of the three periods.

Dave Cousins scored Bucks second marker at 5:06 while Dye was sitting out a penalty against Allen for freezing the puck. He batted it at the side of the net until it finally trickled in across the line.

Bucks third goal was scored while they were a man short. At 10:15, with Don Favell off for tripping, Mike Darnbrough made no mistake on a pass-out from Butch Deadmarsh, who fought and won the puck in the Vernon corner.

Terry Strong got Kelowna's final goal at 14:35, just before he was nailed by Gord Clarke.

At 5:04 of the third per-

iod, Al Southward got Rolston and Lawrence Quechuck started on a three-way pass pattern, easily the prettiest goal of the night, and that left it for Reilly to finish up.
