# Training starts for "B" team

Juvenile and Junior age hockey players will be out in force tonight at Vernon Civic Arena when the local Junior "B" training camp gets under way in preparation for the 1967-68 season.

Six teams will represent the newly formed, Valley-wide Junior "B" league, with Penticton, Summerland, Kelowna, Vernon, Revelstoke and a North Kamloops-Kamloops combine rounding out the loop.

A coach is yet to be officially named to the Vernon squad, but Vernon Dye, a Junior official said today he will help guide the team until the coach is named.

The new league replaces the old Okanagan-Mainline Juvenile circuit and enables over-age Juveniles to compete two extra years in the minor hockey program.
