# Vernon Essos take opener

Vernon Essos made a triumphant debut in their opening game of the B.C. junior "A" hockey league before more than 1,200 home town fans as they scored a convincing 7-5

victory over New Westminster Royals Sunday afternoon in the civic arena. Essos led 3-2 at the end of the first period, 4-3 in the second and outscored the Royals 3-2 in the final

period for the win.

Centreman Tom Williamson led the Vernon attack with two goals and two assists, with Lawrence Quechuk and Larry Hackman scoring twice each

and Bob Mayer knotting the single marker for the big win.

Royals scoring came on two goals and an assist by Alan Dorohoy, with singles by George Watson, Ray Wallis and George Morneau.

Playing a standout game in the Vernon nets was Burnaby import, Jack Gilroy, who pushed aside 34 shots that his former teammates, New Westminster Royals tried to put past him. Crucial saves, particularly in the dying seconds of the game when the Royals pulled their own goalie, Lionel Trudel, in favor of an extra forward, brought cheers from the crowd on more than one occasion.

Every player on the Vernon roster played his heart out to take the home opener, but the kid line of centre Larry Hackman, and wingers Jeff Wilson and Jerry Vachon were the unsung heroes of the game

as they time and again worked in on the Royals' net with amazing agility. Hackman was particularly effective, scoring two goals with Vachon assisting on two of them and Wilson helping on another. The trio of rookies were also effective on defensive plays, breaking up New Westminster rushes time and again.

In Friday night's junior "A" action in Kamloops, the home town Rockets had to work hard for their 5-3 win over Victoria Cougars. Both teams displayed good form with end-to-end rushes, particularly in the first and second periods.

Twin bill action Saturday night in Penticton and Kelowna saw Penticton Broncos edge Victoria 5-3 in Penticton and Kamloops Rockets win 4-3 in a close match at Kelowna over the Buckaroos.

In another Sunday afternoon game, Victoria Cougars hit the win sheet with a narrow 3-2 win over Kelowna that saw the game go right down to the wire before Victoria emerged the victors.
