

Vernon holds share of third

Playing before more than 1,400 cheering home town fans, Vernon Essos scored a convincing 6-3 junior "A" hockey fixture over Victoria Cougars, Friday night in Vernon civic arena.

Lawrence Quechuk paced the Vernon win with a two goal, two assist effort, with singles from Keith Rolston, Jerry Vachon and Mike Perepolkin. Essos team-captain Tom Serviss also had a big night as he picked up three assists to stay with the scoring leaders.

Victoria marksmen were Barry Clarke with a pair of goals, with the single scored by Neil Sanders.

Tied for third

The win moved the Essos into a third place tie with Kamloops Rockets who had a big weekend, scoring a convincing 12-2 win over New Westminster, Saturday and then dropping Victoria 3-1 in a game played Sunday afternoon. Both teams now have 10 points each, one behind second place New Westminster.

In their three game week-

end swing into the Interior, Victoria managed a 1-1 tie against Kelowna Buckaroos at Kelowna, Saturday night. At Penticton, Sunday, the Broncos stopped the failing New Westminster Royals by a score of 10-8 and to maintain their wide margin of wins for the league leadership.

Crowds awed

The Vernon-Victoria match saw plenty of fast top calibre hockey. Both teams kept the crowd awed with their fine play-making moves, with stellar goal-tending on the part of both Murray Finlay for the Cougars and Essos' Jack Gilroy.

Finlay was subsequently the busier of the two as he blocked 36 drives as compared to 23 by Gilroy.

Since the first of the month, the Essos have been displaying an excellent brand of hockey despite the loss of three key players. In the last five games played, Essos record shows a one-loss, two tie, and two win record.

Malinosky dropped

The loss of Tom Williamson through a suspension, injuries to Ken Pollon and a reported back injury to Ivan Malinosky, who, by the way, has been dropped from the line-up, having left town and refusing to report back, has put the onus on the younger team members to keep the club competitive.

Williamson will be back in the line-up for the Kelowna game, on Nov. 24 and Pollon should see action within the next ten days, depending how his knee mends.

To replace Malinosky, coach Odie Lowe is looking at a new left-winger from the prairies to help bolster the front lines. For the defence, Lowe will stay with Dick Marsh, Tom Serviss, Graham Elliott and Bob Mayer.

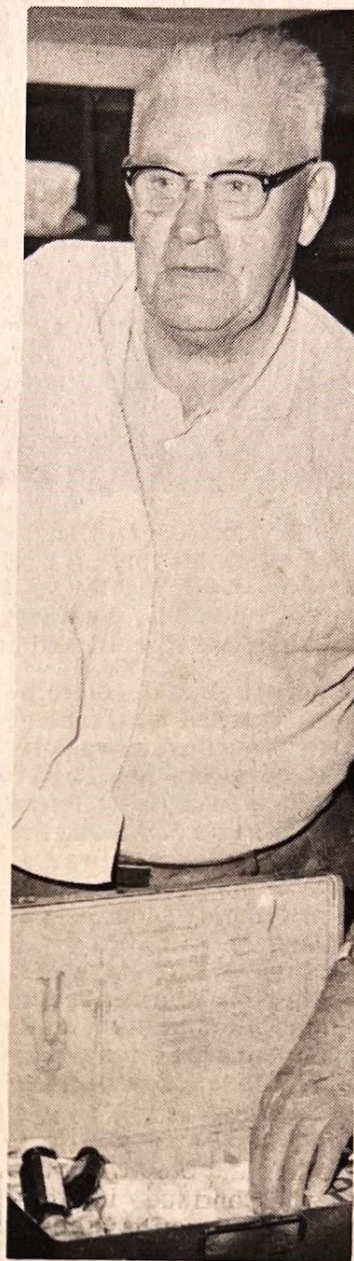
Bob Mayer

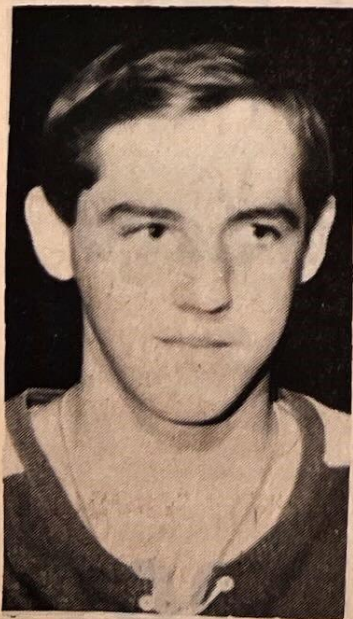
