Vernon gain points on two wins here

Vernon Essos scored two convincing, but somewhat one-sided victories over the weekend in B.C. junior "A" action before their home town fans Saturday and Sunday.

Saturday, the Essos stopped the Victoria Cougars cold with an eight goal onslaught, as compared to three markers put forth by

the Cougars, then on Sunday, Essos romped to an easy 11-4 win over second place New Westminster Royals.

The pair of wins placed Vernon one point behind the second place Royals and Kamloops Rockets.

The Sunday afternoon fixture saw Essos take a 2-1 lead in the opening period and never look back as they scored three times in the second stanza and added six more in the final period to take a comparatively easy win over the New Westminster Royals by a score of 11-4.

Royals managed to score once in the first period, and add three more in the last period for a punitive effort by the previously highly rated coast team.

Defenceman Bob Mayer was the star of the Sunday show as he came through with a stellar performance, scoring three goals and assisting on two more.

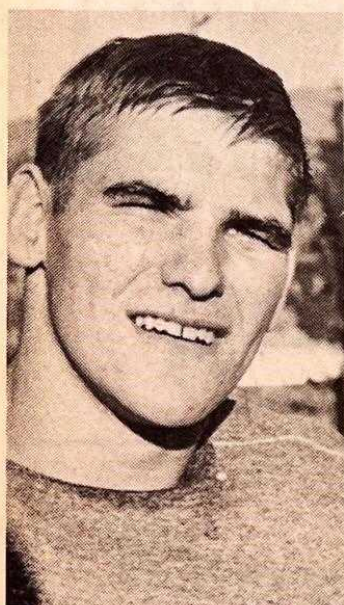

Essos for the most part were up for the games, particularly Sunday, when six individuals scored single markers to go with the Mayer-Wilson combination of five goals.

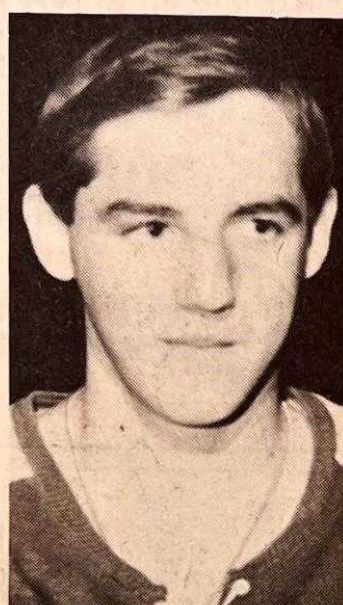
Essos singles came off the sticks of Keith Rolston, Lawrence Quechuk, Tom Williamson, Bob Blanchette and Tom Serviss.
