PIN POINTS



We have just been informed officially by the Canadian Amateur Ski Association, Western Division, that Alpine Ski Test Awards will be available to all Western Division members and members of the Western Division Clubs.

This award is similar in principle to the Cross country Award which has been available in this Division for some years past.

The Alpine Ski Test award is a Maple Leaf Pin with a snowflake crest and the number 1, 2 and 3 to denote the class. The first class award is red with a gold snowflake and the number "1"; the second class

It is expected that initially, examiners will be appointed for the following geographical areas: Lower Mainland, Okanagan and Kamloops, Northern, Vancouver Island and Kootenays.
