## Vernon looking for fifth straight win

Vernon Essos four-game win streak in the last 10 days has certainly raised their chances of at least a playoff spot for the B.C. junior "A" hockey championships next March.

Essos now have a one point edge over Kamloops for second place with a total of 25 points in 22 games played so far this season.

With 18 games left to play in the regular schedule and the fired up way they have displayed their particular talents in the past several games, they stand an excellent chance of taking a major portion of these remaining games.

Stellar performances by veterans Tom Serviss, Tom Williamson and Lawrence Quechuk, particularly in the last two games and the much improved play of rookies Jeff Wilson, Jerry Vachon, Wayne Dye and Larry Hackman has caused every team in the league to sit up and take notice.

Serviss has drawn favorable comment from every official in the B.C. body and there is no doubt he is highly respected by most players, too.

His 15 point spurge since Dec. 16 has raised his year's tally to an impressive 50 and although there are no up to date league statistics available, there is no doubt that he is the present league scoring leader.

Lawrence Quechuk's impressive four goals against Penticton last Friday, certainly proves his value to the team.

Although Williamson was kept off the score sheets because of a six game suspension, this hasn't worried him too much of late. He has come on strong, particularly on Boxing Day when he notched three goals and added two assists against Kamloops.

# Junior A's bounce Hub city crew 12-7

PENTICTON — Vernon Essos more than anything else so far this year, proved one important factor last Friday, that they can win hockey games and against the top team in the league, the Penticton Broncos, and also against questionable refereeing.

Paced by an outstanding four-goal effort on the part of Lawrence Quechuk, Essos served notice on the front-running Broncos, they are the team to watch for in the remaining half of the B.C. junior "A" hockey schedule.

Essos won the game literally in the first period as they withstood some of the harshest refereeing ever witnessed by both local and visiting spectators.

With nine penalties assessed them in the opening period by a referee, Lyle Hanson of Penticton, Essos came through with three sparkling goals, all of them scored while they were a man short.

Hanson had the 500 odd spectators rumbling with disgust as he assessed 13 penalties in the first 20 minutes of the game. Former Penticton Vees star player, Kevin Conway, summed up the feelings of most people on hand when he said simply of the refereeing, "It was lousy."

Other Vernon marksmen for the winning combination were Tom Serviss and Jeff Wilson with two goals and the single added by Keith Rolston.

Before the period ended, Broncos managed to score three times to end the opening stanza at 3-3.

Broncos took a short lived one goal edge early in the second period, but a pretty effort by Jeff Wilson tied the game once more at 6:12 of the middle period.

From then on it was all Vernon as they outscored the Broncos 4-1 to take a 7-4 lead going into the final period.

Essos made it 8-4 with only 20 seconds showing on the clock to start the final period, with Lawrence Quechuk capping his best night of the season with his fourth marker.

Broncos came within one goal as they fired in three straight markers, but Keith Rolston put the game out of reach with the Essos ninth goal with a minute and 20 seconds left in the game.

Gerry Allen, playing his first game of the season in the nets for the Essos, was brilliant as he pushed aside 38 Penticton drives.

On the other end of the rink, Bob Belbin had it comparatively easy as he

stopped 17. Vernon had all the drive, but were just not hitting the mark.

In a Boxing Day match at home, Essos put on another top display as they whitewashed the Kamloops Rockets before nearly 1,400 people.

Paced by a three goal effort by Tom Williamson, who also picked up two assists for a five point day, Essos took a 2-0 lead in the first period, led 8-2 in the second and then went on to win 12-7.

It was win all the way for the Essos, as they dominated the play throughout the 60 minute encounter.

They outshot the Rockets 16-4 in the first period, 17-5 in the second and then completely smothered the hapless Hub City crew 23-8 in the final stanza.
