The Essos were frustrated at every turn to hit the score sheet by the steady play of the Penticton squad, which gave their rookie netminder, Bruce Johnson good cover on most of the Essos drives.

Although the score doesn't really indicate the play of the hometown boys their efforts at some points of the game could have been better.

There is no doubt, the Essos worked hard individually, but they seemed to lack the togetherness they are known to have when working as a smooth unit.

Gerry Allen started in the nets for Vernon, but was replaced early in the second period by regular goalie Jack Gilroy.

The move was just part of the bag of tricks coach Odie Lowe tried in an attempt to get his charges into the swing of things.

Lowe called for Gilroy after Penticton scored two quick goals in the middle period with the three minute mark yet to show on the clock. However, even this manoeuvre failed to stop the Penticton pressure, with Peach City boys finding the mark six times on Gilroy.

The loss to Vernon keeps them still holding down third place in the league standings with 28 points, two behind Kamloops and only two ahead of New Westminster.

Vernon travels to Kamloops on Sunday for what could be the most crucial game of the year to either team.

This is the replay game from Nov. 1 when Vernon protested the use of un-

signed players by Kamloops. The league ruled recently the game would have to be played over and set Sunday for the match.

A win for Vernon would give them a tremendous moral boost, something they are in dire need of at the moment and the points gained would certainly do no harm either.

Both Kelowna and Victoria, currently league cellar dwellers, have of late suddenly come to life with unexpected victories over stronger teams and they could be the ones to watch in last stage of the pennant drive.

Support for the Essos in Kamloops on Sunday, would give the boys a lift and everyone is urged to take the drive to the Hub city and take in the game that starts at 2 p.m. sharp in the North Kamloops sports arena.

Mr. Fuhr's fish leads so far for the Jack Postill memorial trophy donated by R. E. Postill and Sons Ltd. This trophy is awarded annually for the largest Kamloops trout caught during the year in a registered Okanagan Lake derby for North Okanagan fishermen.
