Serviss-Watson join Penticton

B.C. Junior champions, Penticton Broncos, begin a best of seven series this weekend at home against Alberta junior champions the Edmonton Movers for the Western division of the Memorial cup, which is emblematic of junior hockey supremacy across Canada.

Another Vernon born player, George Watson of the New Westminster Royals will also join the Bronco squad. George's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Clem Watson of Vernon are two of the best supporters of junior hockey in B.C.

Serviss, who was team

captain for the Essos, led the league in points this season, with 25 goals, 65 assists (most in league) for a 90 point season. He was selected to the first all-star team and was picked as the most valuable player of the Vernon team, winning the Pat Reilly memorial trophy, presented for the first time this year.

Adrian Blais' goal late in the third period gave Penticton Broncos a 3-2 win over Kamloops Rockets and the British Columbia Junior Hockey League playoff championship Monday night before 2,600 fans.

The win gave the league-champion Broncos the best-of-seven final 4-2 and moves them into the B.C.-Alberta championship against Edmonton Movers in the Memorial Cup eliminations.


That series, also a best-of-seven affair, begins Saturday in Penticton. Second game is Sunday before the action shifts to Edmonton.

Penticton coach, Jack Taggart said he plans to pick up four players from the other BCJHL clubs for the Edmonton series.


He named Denault, Tom Serviss of Vernon, and George Watson and Ray Wallis of New Westminster Royals.
