George Watson named to Nationals squad

For those who feel that minor hockey is a nice pastime for kids who will never amount to anything, take a look at ex-Vernonite George Watson who has just been selected to play with the Canadian National Hockey Team.

Fresh from a rookie training camp that lasted eight days in Winnipeg, he informed The Vernon News that of the 60 boys who tried out for the team, only 12 were selected.

National coach Jackie McLeod and special adviser Father David Bauer, feel a year of experience with the Nationals this year will prepare Watson for the 1970 World Hockey tournament in Winnipeg and also the 1972 Winter Olympics.

For Watson, joining the Nationals involves going to the University of Manitoba and taking part in some of the overseas tours. Minor hockey fans from a few years back will remember him as a "steady player, who just kept digging."

The last time I played in Vernon," he recalls, "we wound up the B.C. juvenile champions."

He played junior hockey with New Westminster, but returned to Vernon every summer.

"I was quite surprised to be selected," Watson said. "Before the intersquad game, I was informed that I would probably be going back to UBC. However, after the game, they

felt that I had the potential to work in with the squad this year."

George is 21, single, and tips the scales at 170 pounds. While playing minor hockey he played centre, and was brought

along the ranks by Vernon Coach Odie Lowe.

George Watson's first taste of action with the Canadian Nationals will be next Thursday when the team takes on the Phoenix Road Runners.
