

# Essos stop Cougars 7-5

The Vernon Essos showed the Victoria Cougars the facts of life Saturday

night in Victoria with a 7-5 victory.

Vernon outplayed, out-

shot, and outskated the Cougars to maintain the lead throughout the game.

Bob Craig got things going on the right foot for the Essos as he scored at 9:54 and 14:01 of the first period. The first goal was assisted by Gord Merrit and Wayne Dye, the second was a lone effort as Craig scored unassisted.

Over 2,000 Victoria fans watched with awe as their home-town heroes were trampled in the Vernon Stampede during the first 20 minutes of the game.

At 2:19 of the second period, Van Horlick scored for Victoria to narrow the margin to 2-1. It was a short-lived margin however, as Wayne Dye boomed one past Forslund to take a 3-1 lead.

Bob Blanchette was the next man to hit the scoreboard as he scored from Jack Marsh and Barry Bleakely, at 14:40.

Down, but not out, the Cougars came back to score two goals at 15:22 and 17:50 from Van Horlick and Evans, to end the period with a 4-3 score.

The home-town Victoria fans were really cheering at 1:31 of the third period when Williams tied the game at 4-4.

However, the Essos are a tough team to catch after the five minute mark of the third period and they really showed their heels to the Cougars as they scored three goals from the sticks of Gerry Vachon, Jack Marsh, and Jeff Wilson to take a 7-4 lead.

Dave Williams of Victoria rounded out the score at 14:26 when brought in the final tally of 7-5.

Al Alexander blocked 30 Victoria attempts on the Vernon net, while another Vernonite, Ed Forslund was called upon to block 32 for Victoria.

The win left Vernon and Victoria tied for second place in the BCJHL.
