Rockets community operation

The Kamloops Rockets Junior Hockey Club, in financial difficulty following the 1968-69 season, is going "public."

The announcement was made last weekend at a press conference in Kamloops.

Ernie Davies, owner of the Junior "A" franchise in Kamloops stated, "In originally purchasing the club, my intention was to keep Junior "A" hockey in Kamloops. However, it is now obvious that additional people are necessary to develop a Junior Hockey Club that will be not only successful in competition but

successful at the gate as well. Considering the present situation of the operation of the club in Kamloops, it is my hope that interested people in the city will participate in the operation which will be run on a community basis."

In offering a solution to the problems plaguing the Rockets, Mr. Davies went on to say, "From this point of view, I would be prepared to have the club go public, which in effect would create an executive from those people participating that would operate the club, develop its policies, and ice a team which will be a truly community operation."
