Know your hockey

As a matter of interest and by popular request, there will be excerpts of the 1969-70 CAHA rules published in the sports pages of The Vernon News over the next few weeks.

These rules are new this year and for those most concerned, such as minor, junior and senior players, referees and most of all the fans, to know these changes will be of great benefit to everyone.

These rules will be printed in order of the rule number starting at number two.

Rule 2—RINK DIMENSIONS

(a) As nearly as possible, the dimensions of the rink shall be 200 feet long and 85 feet wide. The corners shall be rounded in the arc of a circle with a radius of 28 feet. (This applies to new rinks only).

(b—NEW) The rink shall be enclosed by a wall/or fence, known as the boards, which may be constructed of wood or plastic or any other material approved by the Rules Committee. Measured from the surface of the ice, the boards shall not be more than four feet nor less than three feet four inches in height. The surface of the boards facing the ice shall be uniform in color, preferably white, and free from any obstruction or object that may cause injury to players.

Rule 5—GOAL CREASE

(a) In front of each goal, a "Goal Crease" area shall be marked by a red line two inches wide.

(b—NEW) This line shall be drawn as the arc of a circle. Using the central or equidistant point between the two goal posts as a reference point, and with a radius of six (6) feet draw a semi-circle. This arc is to intersect the goal line three feet outside the respective goal posts.

Rule 15—COMPOSITION OF TEAM

(b—NEW) A team shall consist of not less than 12 registered players, one of whom must be a goalkeeper (CAHA Handbook G-6).

* * *

Rule 16—PLAYERS IN UNIFORM

(a) Each team may have 16 players in uniform which includes the regular goalkeeper and one spare goalkeeper, all of whom shall be duly registered in accordance with CAHA regulations. The players registered as goalkeepers shall be eligible to play as goalkeepers only.

(NEW) Teams in Inter-Branch competition may dress and play 17 players, which includes a goalkeeper and one (1) spare goalkeeper.
