Thursday, November 6, members of Air Cadet Squadron 223, gathered in the gymnasium at Harwood School.


After a general warm-up, four basket ball teams were chosen and, under the fearsome team names of Sabres, Typhoons, Voodoos and Yukons the boys went into action.

Kelowna wins, Vernon loses, share fifth spot

Vernon Essos win and a loss over the weekend naturally didn't improve their standings in the B. C. Junior A Hockey League but the obvious improvement in desire to play and try harder was most evident in the action of several players.

Perpetual work horses, Don Manson, Jack Marsh and John Price lived up to their early season standard by heady playmaking in the Sunday fixture with a marked improvement by several of the remaining Essos team members.

While the Essos were breaking even in their weekend games, the shadow of darkhorse Kelowna Buckaroos appeared over the horizon.

Their 5-3 loss to Vernon on home ice Friday didn't seem to faze Kelowna too badly as

they hit the Coast trail and returned with a pair of wins to bring them even in league standings with the Essos who now must share fifth spot with the Buckaroos with a 11 points on five wins and a tie each. Essos however have a two game in hand situation to their favor over the Regatta City club.

Vancouver's pair of wins and a loss and Victoria's single game defeat saw some shuffling near the top of the league ladder.

Kamloops remain on top of the standings with nine wins, a loss and tie for 19 points, two ahead of fast-moving Vancouver.

The newest entry into the league, Vancouver Centennials, edged Penticton 5-2 at Penticton Friday night, took a 3-2 loss to Kamloops Saturday and then came back to down Vernon 3-1 to register 17 points in the standings.

Victoria have dropped to a distant third place with six

wins and a tie for 13 points and Penticton with 12 hold down fourth playoff spot with a narrow point lead over both Essos and Kelowna.

Lowly New Westminster Royals have appeared 12 times in regular play this season but have yet to find the winning combination, having lost 11 games, 10 of them in a row and picked up one tie with Vancouver for one point in the standings.

At Kelowna Friday, Vernon took a first period lead of 2-1, scored a pair of unanswered goals in the second period and then hung on in the final stanza as Kelowna came to life to outscore the Essos 2-1.

Gordon Merritt and Bob Craig shared the spotlight for a change as each came through with a pair of markers with the steady play of John Price paying off again as he came through with the single marker. Vernons only assist credit came on Merritt's second goal in the middle period as Ken Warner was given the assist.

In penalties, Vernon picked up 10 of the 16 handed out by referee John Culos and in the goalie saves department, Vernon's Gary Osborne and Buckaroos Ken Johnson were even with each getting credit for 35 saves.

Playing before nearly 1,200 Vernon fans, Essos gave up a late first period goal to the Centennials, then matched single markers in the middle period and then fell back as the visitors took advantage of a power play situation to add another insurance marker.

Marked difference in the Essos play was their persistent drives into the Vancouver zone only to be thrown back almost bodily by the sureness of the tight defensive moves of the visitors.

Vernon spent a good deal of time in the other zone as their 40 shots on goal will testify but their goal scoring combination was most obviously missing.

Vancouver on the other hand made only 24 shots at the Essos net and made three more pay off to take the important win.

Lawrence Quechuk from Barry Bleackley was the

scoring combination for the Essos while Dennis Metcalfe, Neil Murphy and Ray Todd did the honors for the winners.

In penalties, Vancouver took the edge, picking up nine while Vernon got the nod seven times.

Tomorrow night, Essos

travel to Penticton for a regular league fixture. A win for Vernon could put them into sole possession of fourth place over the Broncos by a slim one point margin.

Next home game for Vernon is next Saturday night when they play host to New Westminster.
