

In B.C. junior play

A pair of hat tricks feature Vernon win

Vernon Essos win and loss over the weekend managed to keep them abreast of the B. C. junior league standings and retain sole possession of fourth place.

With 21 games under their belts so far this season Essos now hold a 25 total point tally on 12 wins eight losses and a tie.

Although Victoria didn't fare too well against Kamloops Sunday, taking a 3-2 loss to the Rockets, they managed to stay up front of the league standings with both Kamloops and Vancouver closing in and sharing

second place with 30 points each.

Friday at Vancouver, Vernon found themselves behind the eight ball throughout their encounter with the Centennials as the Coast team went on to take a 5-1 win over the Essos.

Only Vernon goal came off the stick of Wayne Dye, his 17th of the year, late in the final period of the game played at Kerrisdale Arena.

At New Westminster, it was a different matter as the Vernon club came out strong from the early moments of the game and within six

minutes of the initial stanza had taken a 3-0 lead and then coasted to an easy 7-3 victory over cellar dwelling Royals.

Lawrence Quechuk and Jack Marsh were the big guns for the Essos as they each tallied a hat trick with the single going to captain Bob Mayer.

Essos now prep themselves for a pair of big weekend encounters as they host both New Westminster and Vancouver in single Saturday night and Sunday afternoon fixtures.
