Three points out of a possible eight, or a win and a tie in four tries isn't much to brag about but the Vernon Essos are thanking their lucky stars they did that well last week.

Probably the only thing that saved their bacon was the fact that two of the games (the last two) were against the weakest team in the league.

Earlier in the week Essos took on Pentiction Broncos and Kamloops Rockets and although they showed plenty of hustle, still found themselves on the short end of the scoring in each instance, then Friday night received the shock of their lives as they blew a two goal lead then had to fight back to overcome a one goal deficit to salvage a 3-3 tie with cellar dwelling Kelowna Buckaroos.

Saturday of course, they made up for it all as they again took on the hapless Regatta city boys and easily outscored the visitors to the tune of 9-4.

Now with 25 games under their belts, Essos are still only an average club in almost every department.

They are just under the 500 average in points with a total of 24 on 10 wins, 11 losses and four ties. They have scored 100 goals and have had 104 scored against them and are just five games away from the halfway mark of the B.C. Junior A 60 game schedule.

Another interesting fact about the Vernon club so far this season is that they have dressed a total of 30 players at various times during league play with the roster however now trimmed to the required 17 players.

Scoring punch is one of the big things lacking with the club so far, with a wide spread in points starting with team leader Jim Lawrence with a total of 44 points on 13 goals and 31 assists to his credit while at the other end of the present 15 man scoring line is Jim Inglis with two assists in 10 games played. It might be pointed out that Lawrence has played all 25 games and is up front as a centre man while Inglis, recruited from the local B.C. ranks, is a blueline patroler.

Another Vernon boy, Ed Johnstone is second on the list with 13 goals and 17 assists for 30 points which isn't bad for a midget age player.

Others in line are bunched near the 20 point mark with six players one point from each other. Wayne Dye leads this

group with a total of 22 points on 10 goals and 12 assists and has only been in 11 games to date.

In the penalty tally, Bob Gassoff, another blueline defender has a big lead over the rest of his teammates with a total of 123 penalty minutes of the 620 total by the club.

Getting back to the pair of weekend games, Essos took a 1-0 lead in the first period Friday at Kelowna, added another unanswered marker in the middle frame then let Kelowna come back to tie it before four minutes had gone by in the third period, then added insult to injury by taking a one goal lead near the 16 minute mark of the stanza only to have Vernon suddenly snap their drolmurs by coming back 13 seconds later with the equalizer off the stick of Jim Lawrence.

The Essos were not playing up to their real capabilities, while Kelowna on the other hand were.

Many fans expressed surprise and delight at the way their Kelowna team played throughout, and when it was all over gave their team a rousing cheer for a job well done.

Vernon's first string of Jim Lawrence, Wayne Dye and Ed Johnstone did most of the damage to Kelowna with each man scoring singles then getting additional points for being in on the assist column.
