Five Vernon players lead league scoring

With three weeks of hockey now completed in the B.C. Junior A hockey league, first statistics of the league now

released show some pattern of the way things may be over the next few months. Both Vernon and Pentiction

share top place in the team standings with 10 points each, but Pentiction and Vancouver will play three games this

weekend while Vernon sits idle until next Tuesday. This surely will put Vernon down a peg or two as Vancouver is just a single point back of the leaders at this time.

All the rest of the teams; Chilliwack, Kamloops and Kelowna also take to the ice these next few days with each team playing a pair of games.

The standings show as mentioned, Vernon and Pentiction on top with 10 points, followed by Vancouver with 9, Kamloops in fourth with 7, Chilliwack next with 6 and Kelowna on the bottom so far with only two points.

In the individual scoring and point list, Vernon players have major share of the top placings with five Essos leading in that order with fifth spot being shared by a Chilliwack player.

John Price is on top with a 17 point total on the basis of five goals and 12 assists, which is also tops in the league assist column.

Ernie Gare holds second place, just one point back of Price on a 7-9 record, third place is held by Les Salo with eight goals and six assists for 14 points and Wayne Dye is in fourth place with a 13 point

listing on eight goals and five assists.

Sharing fifth spot is Essos captain Jim Lawrence who has a 3-9 record for 12 points along with Larry Davies of Chilliwack who has a four goal, eight assist tally so far.

While John Price has the most assists with 12, the league leading goal scorer is Jerry Holland of Kamloops who has found the mark on nine separate occasions.

In the goalies statistics, Vernon's Mike Smithson actually has one of the better records based on his 2.8 goals against average in five games played.

He has pushed aside 122 shots while allowing 14 to get past him. In the five games he has taken part in, Smithson also has recorded 260 minutes between the posts.

The other Vernon netman, Earl Bowie, has also a good record with four games listed he has stopped 101 shots and allowed 18 to get past him for a 4.5 goals against average.

Vernon Essos also stand well in another department, they have taken advantage of nine power plays to score goals which at this time stands best in

the league.

Other highlights of the individual lists show the most personal penalties going to Ivan Christenson of Kamloops who has 14, while the most minutes spent in the box goes to Ken Wright of Vancouver who has sat out a total of 68 penalized minutes.

Vancouver Centennials have picked up the most penalty minutes as a team with a listing

of 312 with 95 individual calls being made.

Next Vernon Essos game will see the locals host Kamloops here Tuesday, Nov. 1 with game time set for 8 p.m.

Essos management will open the doors at this game to all Lumbly minor hockey players, and between period entertainment will feature Vernon, and Lumbly pups putting on an exhibition game.



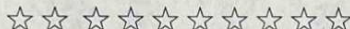
