Junior 'A' hockey

Vernon wrecking crew drub Richmond 10-2

Vernon 10—Richmond 2
 Vernon Essos started their third month of B.C. Junior A Hockey League action off on a win note Saturday by literally bombing a hapless Richmond Centennial squad by a one sided 10-2 score before nearly 1,000 home town fans.

For the Essos it was their 16th win in 21 starts and the victory, coupled with a 6-3 loss by second place Penticton Broncos the same night, moves the Essos into a solid four point lead in the six team league.

Paced by the league's individual scoring leaders, John Price, Jim Lawrence, Wayne Dye, Ernie Gare and Ed Johnstone, Essos seemingly had little trouble in scoring goals over the often inept Centennials.

Essos scored a single unanswered marker in the first period, added five goals to Centennials only two of the game in the second frame then walked in at will to score four more unanswered goals in the final period.

A pair of goals by John Price and Jim Lawrence with singles from Bill Vernon, Wayne Dye,

George Fargher, Ed Johnstone, Ernie Gare and Bob Powell rounded out the scoring while 10 Vernon players featured in the assist column of the point list.

Bill Vernon, Jim Lawrence and Ed Johnstone were at the right place to pick up two assists each with Ernie Gare coming up with three assists and singles by Dave Neil, John Price, Les Salo, Jeff Shirley, Dennis Bergeron and Bob Powell.

Notching the two goals for the losers were Don Jamieson and newcomer Fred Parent who was with Penticton last year.

It was the Essos of old as they came out strong right from the start and seemingly toyed with the Richmond boys for the first 20 minutes with their only goal coming at the mid-point of the period when Jim Lawrence took advantage of a power play to score from close in with a jamb of players crowding the Richmond net.

Second period, Essos jumped into a 4-0 lead with the first two goals of the period coming a minute apart at 6:50 and 7:50 with Price and Powell featuring. By the way, it was

Powell's first goal of the season and with his assist later in the game brought his point total to nine.

Both goals came off the slap shot variety with Price taking aim from about 15 feet in front of the net and Powell slamming a point shot that curved into the upper right corner with Richmond goalie Tony Russo partly screened on the play.

Richmond goals at 14:36 and 17:55 gave them some measure of hope for a couple of minutes before Essos got back on the track and banged in another pair of their own in the dying seconds of the middle period.

Bill Vernon's hard drive from inside the blueline brought a roar from the partisan crowd as he let fly with Russo charging out of his net at him and sprawling to try for a piece of the puck only to watch the rubber glance off a Centennial defenceman and roll lazily into a wide open net.

This goal came at the 19:10 mark and 39 seconds later it was John Price coming up with his second goal of the game. Price leads the league by the way, with a grand total of 51 points based on a fine 20 goal and 31 assists record. The Price goal coming at the 19:49 mark to end the period scoring.

Goals at 9:36, by Jim Lawrence, a power play goal by Ernie Gare at 14:44, an Ed

Joyntone drive at 17:43 and George Fargher's second goal of the season at 18:50 rounded out the period and the game scoring.

Essos outshot the Richmond boys by a 35-20 difference with Essos picking up eight of the 13 penalties.

Next action for the Essos will see them in Kelowna next Friday, travel to Kamloops Saturday night then host Kelowna at home Sunday night with that game due for a 7:30 p.m. start.

Second place Penticton will also have a three game stint on the weekend when they travel to the coast but will get a chance to come within two points of Vernon before that when they meet Kamloops at home on Tuesday night.
