Vernon Juniors are down to .500 average

Penticton 7, Vernon 6

While it seems almost too early in the season to be considering individual games of the Junior 'A' loop as being worth four points but this is what happened Tuesday night in Penticton.

Vernon Essos were looking for their third win in four starts and a chance to beat undefeated Penticton Broncos in game five of their league schedule.

With Penticton going into the game with a league leading eight points and Vernon behind with a four point tally, the difference between the point margin of the two clubs suddenly became all important.

If Vernon could have won the game they would have only been two points back of the league leaders, but rather, are now sitting in a four way tie for third place and are six points behind.

Mind, it took over eight minutes of an over-time period for the Broncos to win the game 7-6 but Essos had their chance too as they held leads of 3-0, 5-2 and 6-5 before Broncos came back to tie it three times, the third time with only two minutes and 15 seconds remaining in regular time.

Veteran Dan Ashman led Penticton with a hat trick, two of these tying goals but it was

team captain Bob Nicholson's overtime goal that made him the hero of the game.

All of the Vernon scoring was single efforts started off by Tim Sanche with Ken Reid, Dallas Chappal, Lyle Brewer, Bob Bergoyne and Bob Marsh following in order.

Actually Essos put on a real team effort as 11 of their 17 man roster picked up scoring or assist points with Bob Bergoyne the only man to get one of each.

Those in on assists were; Ken King, Dave Caldwell, Dennis Bergeron, Don Murdock and Ken Price.

Next big test for the Essos comes with their first Coast trip of the season when they meet Vancouver Villas at Kerrisdale arena Friday night and take a trip by boat for a Saturday night game in Nanaimo to meet the Clippers for the first time as they join with Bellingham Blazers as new league entries.

Next home game will see host Penticton Broncos on Tuesday, Oct. 17, with game time 8 p.m.
