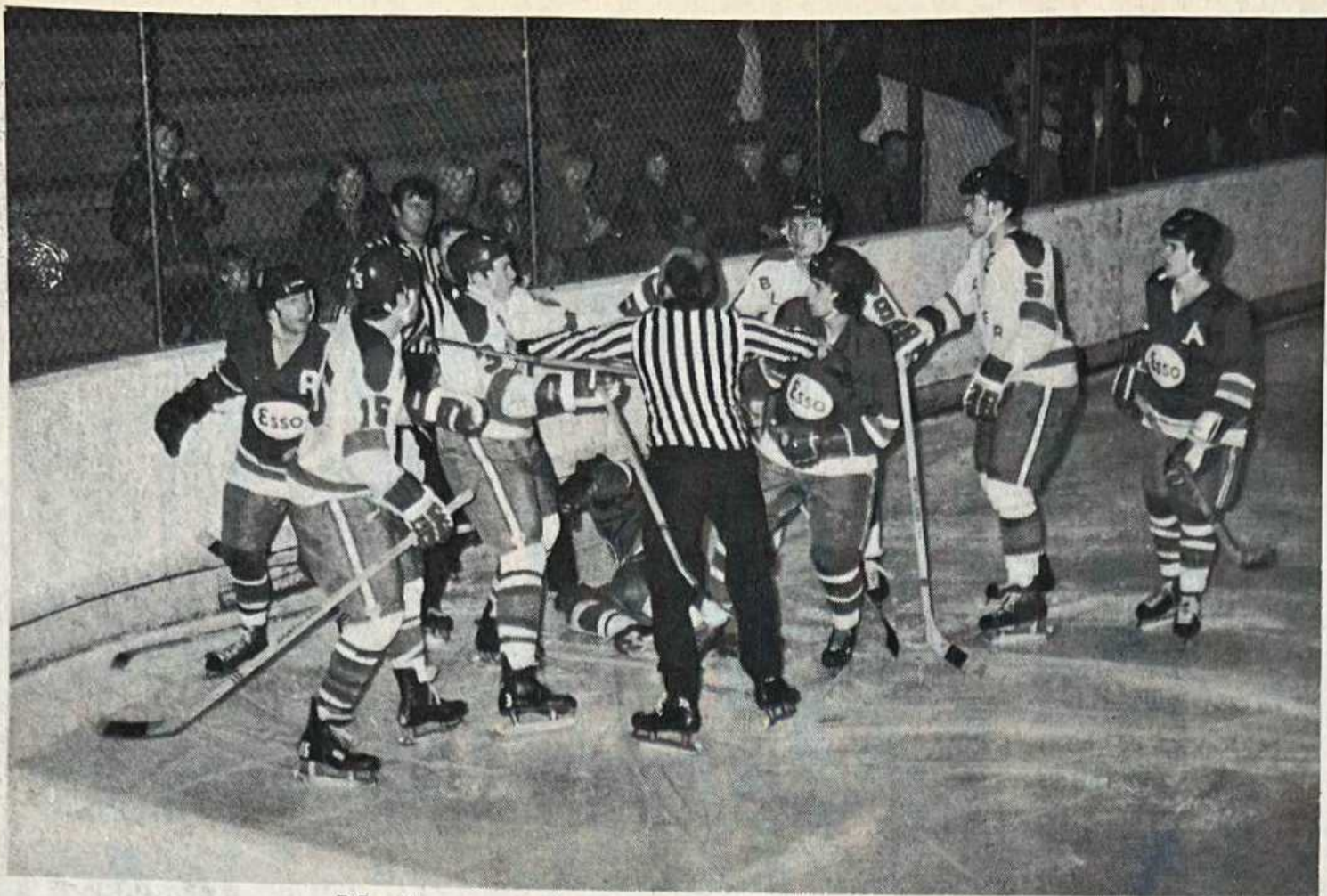

Vernon split pair of games

A 22 goal scoring spree, including a one-sided 16-4 victory and a heartbreaking 7-6 loss in a sudden death overtime period, did nothing more than to drop Vernon Essos into a third place tie in B.C. Junior League action this past weekend.

Essos started out well with the big 16-4 win over Bellingham Blazers Friday night, maintaining a one point lead over Kamloops Rockets who were about to win the next night over the same hapless crew from the Lower Mainland by an 8-2 difference.

Then Sunday night the big confrontation between the two clubs came about with Essos taking the sudden death overtime period loss to push them one point behind the Rocket crew by a score of 7-6.

Friday night Essos jumped into a four goal lead, allowed some key defensive lapses to let the Blazers tie the game with four straight goals of their own before getting untracked to come back with 12 straight unanswered goals for the wide margin of victory.

Big guns in this game saw Don Murdoch roar through the Bellingham zone with four goals and three assists while Tim Sanche and Dan Kuntz came through with hat tricks each with Kuntz also in on four major assist plays.

Scoring pairs of markers for the Essos were Dave Caldwell and Brian Wortley with Greg Howe and Dave Dorriss picking up singles.

Along with defenceman Tim Sanches' effort, other blueline patrollers picking up important points were Cliff Lane and Bob Bergoyne who tallied three assists each.

Playing once again before the home town Sunday night, Essos found the shoe on the other foot early in the game with Kamloops coming up with the first four goals, however, Essos came back with five of their own to take a short lead, let up again to see the game tied then moved ahead once more with

the Rockets determination paying off when they tied the Essos once more in the third period and forcing the extra period.

While the Sunday game left much to be desired with the time consuming arguments over rules with the referees taking up much of the time, plus the added cheap theatrics of Rocket coach Joe Tennant walking around the ice surface in leather brogues trying to catch up to referee Bob Kemp, (in the second period) with the game drawn out to nearly three hours before the final whistle allowed everyone to go home shaking their heads.

Penalties also kept both games down as 21 were called Friday night and 29 called Sunday night.

Scoring highlight for the Essos Sunday night saw Greg Howe lead the Essos with a well earned hat trick with singles by Dennis Bergeron, Tim Sanche and Don Murdoch.

Essos now take to the road

with games in the lower mainline area this weekend where they are scheduled to play Bellingham twice, Nanaimo and Chilliwack.
