# Juniors complete tough seven games

With only 10 games remaining to round out the 62 game schedule, Essos must console themselves with the fact they stand little chance of changing their fourth place position and it looks as though they will meet Penticton Broncos in the semi-final Interior series due to start right after the March 10 completion date of the regular schedule.

Penticton have been in a hot and cold slump of late and they are now nine points back of the league leaders, Kamloops Rockets, who have had everything almost their own way the past while.

Looking back over the seven games, Essos hosted Bellingham last Thursday night and won a 4-2 decision, Friday night in Vancouver they lost a 7-5 game to the Villas then Saturday night at Chilliwack, Essos got back on the win column with a 5-3 win, Sunday afternoon at Nanaimo it was the Clippers coming up with a 6-4 win and at Bellingham on Monday night it was Vernon once more with a 5-2 victory.

Vernon's win and loss record to date show them with only 23 wins in 52 games played losing 28 and tying once for 47 points, 14 back of third place Kelowna and 23 behind Penticton and a big 32 points behind the leading Rockets.

Looking at the Vernon individual team scoring statistics, Tad Campbell has now taken over first place with an excellent seven goals and eight assists picked up in the last seven games for a grand total of 33 goals and 35 assists.

Campbell replaces Dan Kuntz who sat on top all season but who has missed several games lately.

this Saturday when Essos host the Coast leaders, Nanaimo and this game should prove interesting as Essos have not had too much luck with the Clippers, losing five of the seven games played so far this season.

Game time for this encounter at civic arena has been set for 8 p.m. and it is hoped more fans will start coming out as the Essos go into the home stretch of the league schedule.
