British Columbia Junior Hockey League fans saw two one-man shows in games at Nanaimo and Bellingham, Wash. Wednesday night.

In Nanaimo, Daryl Zelinski scored three of White Rock's four goals to lead the Centennials to a 4-3 victory over Nanaimo Clippers and in Bellingham, Langley's Allan

Young grabbed the spotlight with two goals to lead the Lords to a 3-2 victory over the Blazers.
