# Vikings armour tough ... win five straight

Vernon Vikings are still riding the high tide of the B.C. junior A league following a hectic weekend of action on all fronts.

Vikings came up with a pair of back to back wins Friday and Saturday to post five straight wins in as many outings so far this season and now hold a two point lead in the eight team standings.

Close behind, three teams are currently battling it out for second place as Kelowna, Penticton and White Rock share eight points apiece.

Starting to make their move is Bellingham who are in fifth spot with a six point tally with Nanaimo, Langley and Chilliwack sharing the cellar spot with four points each.

One interesting aspect still holds in the league with 27 games played, only five of these have been won by visiting teams, which makes the home town ice the major asset to the hosting team.

With Vernon holding the lead and having only played five games, their record has to be rated as good with only one other team having played less games, and that being the Penticton Broncos who also

have yet to taste defeat in their first four outings.

Vikings are also well up in the goals scoring average with 6.5 goals being averaged out in each game played. Penticton comparison is also good with a 5.7 average. Kelowna also is doing well with an average of seven goals per game.
