# Langley finally has a rink to play in

A crowd of 850 fans watched Langley Lords open Langley's new arena in impressive fashion Wednesday, the Lords dumping White Rock Centennials 6-3 in a B.C. Junior Hockey League game.

In a second game, Bellingham Blazers went under for the sixth straight time, 4-3 to the visiting Chilliwack Bruins, on Gary Huth's goal at the 25-second mark of sudden-death overtime.

At Langley, the Lords doubled the count on White Rock in each period as they carried leads of 2-1 and 4-2.

Allen Young scored twice for the home team, with singles coming from Sandy Bain, Brian Henderson, Dave Hatheway and Dwight Bailey.

Derel Zelinsky, playing his last game for White Rock before moving up to Calgary Centennials of the Western Canada League, scored White Rock's first-period goal. Don Festerling scored in the second and Fred Berry in the third.

Langley was full value for the victory, outshooting the visitors 42-17.

In Bellingham, the Blazers carried a 1-0 lead into the second period but couldn't hold the advantage. It was 2-2 after two.

Huth scored twice for Chilliwack, the others going to Vern Quaroni and Dave Sharples.

Dean Arnett, John Stone and Doug Davis scored for the Blazers, who were cheered on by a crowd of 1,500.

Bellingham outshot Chilliwack 43-28.
