

Lords win 11-4

Broncos lose ground to Vikings in BCJHL

LANGLEY, B.C. (CP)—Langley Lords kept their unbeaten home record intact and moved into a tie for second spot in the British Columbia Junior Hockey League's coast division Wednesday with an 11-4 thumping of Penticton Broncos.

The Lords, who haven't lost at home since moving into their new arena two weeks ago, scored nine goals in the final two periods to trim the Broncos.

Sandy Bain, Allen Young and Dave Hathaway each scored two goals to lead Langley, which also received single goals

from Don Moores, Barry Beck, Rod Zavaduk, Dwight Bailey and Tom Williamson.

Daryl Ferner had two goals and Pat Severyn and Doug Lawton one apiece for the Broncos.

Brad Cifra started in goal for Penticton but was lifted after allowing six goals and stopping 17 shots. Mario Dibella finished up by allowing five goals and kicking out 12. Mark Earp went the distance in the Langley net, turning aside 30 shots.

Langley now trails coast division leader Nanaimo Clippers by a single point. Nanaimo has

15 points, but has played a game more than Langley.

Penticton remained in third spot in the interior with 27 points, one fewer than Kelowna Buckaroos.

Riders prep for Saturday

"I know our guys will work hard on the field and if they want to go downtown and take in a little atmosphere, that's fine."
