

Thanks to Broncos

Over-time goal helps keep Vikings on top

Langley Lords moved up, but Kelowna Buckaroos let opportunity slip through their fingers in British Columbia Junior Hockey League games Tuesday night.

The Lords edged Nanaimo Clippers 4-3, but the Buckaroos, enjoying a 3-1 lead at one point, collapsed against Penticton and allowed the Broncos to take a 6-5 overtime victory.

In Langley, Lane Lavik and Dwight Bailey of Langley got

two goals apiece to scuttle the Clippers. The Lords moved into a 3-2 lead in the second period and increased the margin to 4-2 before Nanaimo got a late goal.

Dale Ewasiuk, Kirk Fyffe and Bruce Van Camp scored for the Clippers, who fell three points behind Langley in the race for top spot in the league's coast division.

In Kelowna, a goal by Pat Severyn at 1:16 of a 10-minute sudden death overtime propelled the Broncos past the

Buckaroos.

Daryl Ferner added two goals for Penticton and Rob Dyck, Brian James and Mike Holmes each counted once.

Mark Lofthouse got three Kelowna goals, with the others going to Ken Shewchenko and Les Strachan.

A win for the Buckaroos would have moved them into sole possession of first place in the league's interior division. Kelowna remains tied with Vernon Vikings.
