## Blazers succumb to Lords 8-2 thumping

LANGLEY, B.C. (CP)—Goals by Daryl Dodman and Dave Hatheway while killing penalties in the first period put Langley Lords in front to stay as they rolled to an 8-2 victory over Bellingham Blazers in British Columbia Junior Hockey League action Wednesday night before 1,009 fans.

Bob MacGillivray and Ryan Walter counted twice each for the Lords, who led 2-1 at the end of the opening frame and 5-2 at the close of the second.

John Gregory and Don Moores were the other Langley scorers, while Paul Enquist got both Bellingham markers in the fight-filled game.

The win, Langley's seventh

straight on home ice and 20th here since they began playing in their own rink part-way through the season, gave the Lords a 15-point lead over the second-place Blazers in the BCJHL Coast division.

Langley picked up nine minor penalties, five fighting majors and one misconduct, while Barry Beck of the Lords got a game misconduct for being involved in two fights.

Bellingham had six minors, five fighting majors, and game misconducts to Randy Rudnyk and Harold Phillipoff for being in two fights each.

Ian McWilliams stopped 33 shots in a losing cause, while Mark Earp of the Lords had to make only 18 saves.
