Hometown fans saw Kelowna Buckaroos blast Vernon Vikings 6-2 and Penticton Broncos edge Merritt Centennials 6-5 Friday.

In a British Columbia Junior Hockey League game in Nanaimo, Langley Lords beat the Clippers 4-3.

First-place Kelowna, with 63 points, now is 11 ahead of Vernon.

Penticton, with 45 points, is in no danger of losing third place in the Interior division to Merritt which has only 26 points.

In the Coast division, Langley, with 51 points, is still at the top, followed by Bellingham with 34 points. Nanaimo, with 28 points, has moved into third place, supplanting Chilliwack which has only 27.

Buckaroos had goals from Tom Onno, Mark Lofthouse, Curt Fraser, Randy Naito, Dale Turner and Archie McKinnon. Scoring for Vernon were Ron Dick and Don Murdoch.

A last-minute penalty to defenceman Wade Smith killed any chances of Nanaimo tying the contest and forcing an overtime frame.

Sandy Bain led Langley with two goals while Brian Henderson and Allen Young added singles. Dale Ewasiuk, Fenton Gale and Brian day scored for Nanaimo.
