

BERRY SETS RECORD

Broncos move ahead of sagging Vikings

Fred Berry plays for a last-place hockey team, but the British Columbia Junior Hockey League sharpshooter had two reasons for rejoicing Tuesday night.

Berry scored his 58th and 59th goals of the season as his team, Merritt Centennials, managed one of their rare wins with a 6-2 decision over Nanaimo Clippers. Besides the fruits of victory, Berry's goals shattered the league's

goal-scoring record of 57 in a season.

In the other game, Penticton Broncos vaulted over Vernon Vikings into second place in the league's interior division with a 4-2 win over Kelowna Buckaroos.

In Penticton, the Broncos scored a pair of third-period goals to break a 2-2 tie and tame the high-flying Buckaroos.

Brothers Pat and Marc Sev-
eryn, Doug Lawton and Dean

Dyer scored for Penticton, with Kurt Fraser and Mark Lofthouse counting for Kelowna.

Penticton now has 74 points in the interior, one more than Vernon, but 24 behind Kelowna. Merritt is fourth and last with 41 points.

Nanaimo remained last in the coast division with 40 points, seven less than third-place Chilliwack. Langley is first with 75, a 23-point margin over Bellingham.
