

Kelowna takes 2-1 series lead

Langley Lords could wrap up their best-of-seven British Columbia Junior Hockey League semi-final with a victory tonight in Bellingham over the Blazers, while Kelowna Buckaroos travel to Penticton holding a 2-1 edge in their series.

The Lords bombed the Blazers 7-2 Tuesday night at Langley for their third straight semifinal win and the Buckaroos beat the Broncos 4-1 in Kelowna.

Langley scored five unanswered goals in the third period for the win, getting two each from Ryan Walter and Sandy Bain and one by Bob MacGillivray. Lane Lavik and Brian Henderson got the other

markers for the Lords in a game that was tied 1-1 at the end of the first period and 2-2 starting the third.

Wayne Jeske notched both Bellingham goals.

Kelowna led 1-0 at the close of the first period and held a 3-1 lead over Penticton at the end of the second.

Dale Turner scored twice for the Buckaroos and Dale Constanzo and Les Strachan got the others.

Mark Patterson counted on a Penticton power play in the second frame to spoil chances of a shutout for Kelowna goalie Jerry Nekrasoff.
