Bucks take lead in junior finals

Langley Lords made it to the British Columbia Junior Hockey League championships Friday night, but will have to wait for the Penticton Broncos-Kelowna Buckaroos series to finish for an opponent.

Langley defeated Bellingham Blazers 6-3 to take the best-of-seven semi-final 4-1 and Kelowna romped over Penticton 8-2 to jump to a 3-2 lead in that series.

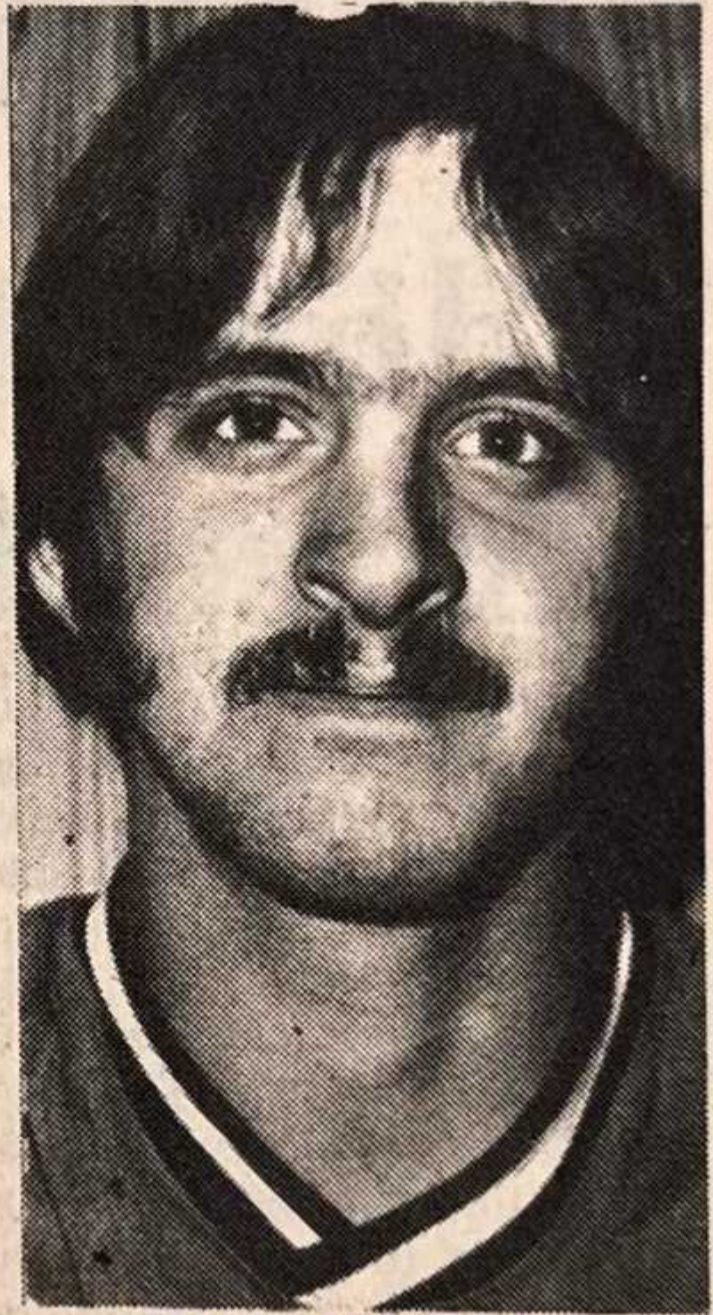
In Kelowna, Dale Costanzo scored three goals and assisted on two others to the delight of the hometown crowd of 2,671. Duane Monteith and Archie McKinnon added two goals each for the Buckaroos while Curt Fraser scored one goal. Kirk Aulin, Wade Jowett and Chad Campbell scored for the losers.

Kelowna led 2-1 after the first period and took a 4-2 lead into the third.

Kelowna goalie Bill Stankoven faced 39 shots while Andy Mydlak and Harvey Fairgrey combined in the Penticton net to handle 31 shots.

An outbreak of fighting at the end of the game resulted in misconducts being handed out to Tom Onno of Kelowna and Rod Zavaduk of Penticton.

In Langley, Allen Young and Sandy Bain led the Lords with

two goals each while Chris Dyer and Dave Hatheway each scored one goal. Mark Arnett scored two goals for Bellingham and Doug Davis scored a single.

Langley led 4-0 after the first period and 4-1 after 40 minutes.

Langley goalie Mark Earp kicked away 24 shots while Bellingham netminder Ian McWilliams stopped 35 shots.

Kelowna will travel to Penticton today for the sixth game.
