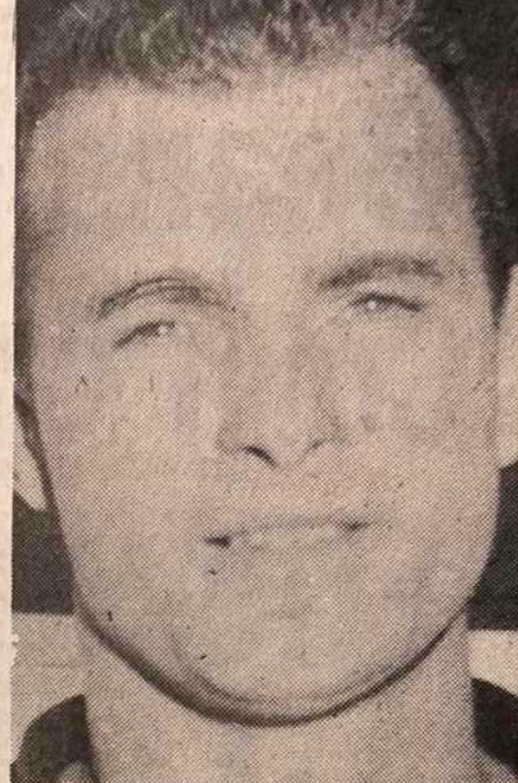

# Power skating school features top teachers

Three of Vernon's best-known sportsmen, Odie Lowe, Tom Serviss, and Jim Moro, will be instructing at the Vernon Power Skating School, being held in the Vernon Curling Rink July 3 to 6.

The school will feature one instructor per 20 boys. Each boy will receive five hours of instruction for the \$5 entry fee.

The sessions will be held nightly from 6:30 to 7:45 p.m. and from 8 to 9:15 p.m. Participants will have their choice as to what time they will attend the school.

## WHA PLAYER

Serviss, a graduate of the Vernon Minor Hockey Association and later the Vernon Essos, played in the Central Pro Hockey League until he joined Los Angeles Sharks of the World Hockey Association in 1972.

Serviss will be playing with the Michigan Stags next season, the club which has replaced the now defunct Sharks.

Lowe and Moro are cer-

tainly no strangers to veteran hockey fans in this area.

Odie played his minor and two years of junior hockey in Winnipeg before finishing out his junior A career in Lethbridge.

He split two years between the New York Rovers of the Quebec Senior League, and New York Rangers of the NHL, before joining St. Paul of the United States Hockey League.

## SIX YEARS

From there he went to Winnipeg Maroons of the Western Hockey League and then joined Vernon Canadians, where he starred for six seasons.

He coached juvenile for two years and then coached the Vernon Blades, and later Vernon Essos junior A hockey club for six seasons. Odie has been actively involved in minor hockey for eight years.

Moro played his minor and junior hockey in Fort William, Ontario. He was a member of the Vernon Canadians for two years and later spent three years in the Western Hockey League, two with Calgary Stampeders and one with Victoria Cougars.

## JUNIOR COACH

After his stint in the WHL, he returned to Vernon as coach of the Vernon Blades Junior Club. However, he left the club half-way through the season and joined Spokane Jets, where he played for one and one-half years.

He then again returned to Vernon and took over as coach of the Blades.
