

Pacific League given 'A' status

British Columbia Amateur Hockey Association President Ray Peebles announced Monday, in Quesnel, that the Pacific Junior Hockey League has been granted junior A status.

That will mean the B.C. Junior Hockey League champ will have to meet the PJHL champ to decide which team will represent B.C. in the Centennial Cup, symbol of supremacy in tier two junior A hockey in Canada.

That is the second decision made by the BCAHA, during the last two weeks, the BCJHL has not been pleased with.
