Bruins record three victories on successful interior swing

Chilliwack 4, Vernon 0

Chilliwack Bruins did something over the weekend few B.C. Junior Hockey League coast division teams have ever done.

Bruins had a successful road trip throughout the interior, recording three wins in four starts.

After being pounded 9-1 by league-leading Kelowna Buckaroos Friday, Bruins started their win streak in Vernon Saturday with a 4-0

win over the Vikings.

Sunday, in Merritt, the Bruins dumped the Centennials 5-1, and Monday in Penticton, Chilliwack edged the Broncos 6-5.

GREAT NETMINDING

A combination of great goaltending by Chilliwack's Dennis Welsh and bad shooting by the Vikings, gave the young Bruins' netminder the first shutout of the season in the BCJHL.

Chilliwack led 1-0 at the end of the first period when Tom O'Neill beat Vernon goalie Jim Scammel with a slap shot from the wing, at 1:41.

Bruins stretched their lead to 3-0, after 40 minutes, on goals by Tom Zelke and Steve McDonald.

Final goal came on a power play, at 7:55 of the third period, while Vikings' were serving a bench penalty for too many men on the ice. Al Cunningham beat Scammel from close-in for that goal.

Vernon was assessed 19 minutes in penalties while Bruins spent 17 minutes in the sin bin.

SEVERAL CHANCES

Vikings had several great scoring opportunities, particularly late in the second period, but Welsh was unbeatable. He made great saves off Darrell Billsten,

Grand Sidnick, and Greg Walmsley, all from point blank range.

Perhaps Vernon's best scoring chance came in the opening period when centre Dwight Bailey fed a breakaway pass to Brad Schultz. However, Schultz could not control the puck and did not get a shot away.

Vikings, now in second place in the interior division with six

points, four behind, Kelowna, battle third-place Penticton tonight, in the Peach City.

Vikings will have hustling Marty Stein back in the line-up, after sitting out a three-game suspension.
