

Iannone gives Broncos victory

Penticton 6, Vernon 5

Penticton Broncos came from-behind in the dying minutes Tuesday to edge Vernon Vikings 6-5 in B.C. Junior Hockey League action in Penticton.

Del Iannone spearheaded the Broncos' comeback with goals at 16:19 and 18:29, of the third period, erasing a 5-4 Vernon lead.

Only 69 seconds before Iannone's first goal, Greg Walmsley had put the Vikings ahead for the first time in the game.

Jim Grant and Dean Arnet gave the Broncos an early 2-0 lead but goals by Grant Sidnick and Darrell Booth, at 15:15 and 16:36, of the first period, tied the score for Vernon.

But, Penticton came right back, and a goal by Kirk Aulin gave the host club a 3-2 lead at the end of the first period.

Gord McKay scored the only goal of the middle period which sent Penticton into the final 20 minutes with a 4-2 lead.

TWO GOALS

Brad Schultz, who in Vikings' first eight games, managed only one goal, picked up a pair of markers at 7:03 and 14:55, tying the game, and setting the stage for Walmsley's go-ahead goal.

Schultz's goals were perhaps the best of the night, the first coming on a breakaway and the second, on a slap shot from the wing.

The win moved Penticton to within one point of second-

place Vernon in the Interior Division standings. Kelowna has 10 points, Vernon six, Penticton five, and Merritt two. However, the Broncos have one game-in-hand on the Vikings.

Second-place will be on the line Saturday when Vernon hosts the Broncos.

Vernon goalie Darrell Furmanek made 47 saves Tuesday while Broncos' Rany Struch turned away 31 shots.

Vikings took eight of 12 minor penalties and each team was assessed three fighting majors.

Late in the second period, Penticton's Greg Milliard was sent to the dressing room after being handed a five-minute major for spearing, and an automatic match misconduct.
