

# Vernon planning no major changes

Vernon Vikings' coach Joe Tennant is planning on going with the same line-up Saturday, when the Vikings host Penticton Broncos, as he did Tuesday when his club was edged 6-5 by the Broncos.

Tennant told the Daily News the only change will be in the nets. He has been using a three-goaltender system, rotating Darrell Furmanek, Keith Ferner, and Jim Scammel, game-by-game.

Tennant said, "I feel we're close to being strong enough now, and I am not planning any major changes.

"We could maybe use another forward, and perhaps another defenceman, but if we don't get them, we can go with what we have now."

## NOT OUTPLAYED

Tennant feels his club was not outplayed Tuesday in Penticton when they were edged 6-5 by the Broncos, and outshot by a considerable margin.

He said, "We killed a lot of penalties which accounted for many of the shots, and the only reason we lost was that we committed two costly mistakes in the final minutes.

"I feel we are improving every game and I'm satisfied with the way the team is progressing."
