# VIKINGS LOOKING FOR OLDER PLAYERS

Vernon Vikings travel to Kelowna tonight to meet the first place Buckaroos in B.C. Junior Hockey League action at 8 p.m.

Sunday in Kelowna, Bucks trounced the Vikings 9-3. Vernon coach Joe Tennant told the Daily News this morning he is planning no changes for tonight's game, but by next week, he hopes to have some new faces in the line-up.

Tennant said, "I feel we have the players now, to beat Kelowna, if they had the right attitude. But, right now they don't."

Tennant hopes to have two or three older players, to settle down his young club, within one week. He has already acquired a 180 pound centre, from Brandon, who should be here this weekend.

The Vernon coach said, "We have to get tougher inside and get our forwards skating."

While Kelowna has full complement of four 20-year-olds, and several 19-year-olds, Vernon has no 20-year-olds, and only three 19-year-olds. The majority of the club is 16 or 17.

Kelowna may have to cut one of its older players this week if a rumor circulating today is true. Reportedly, rugged defenceman Dale Turner, is back in Kelowna, and ready to play for the Bucks.

If Turner does join the Kelowna club, one 20-year-old will be released, possibly winger Brad Owens.

Jim Scammel, who despite allowing nine goals Sunday, played a strong game, will be in the nets again tonight for the Vikings. Goalie Darrell Furmanek, who received a broken finger in a game last week, is expected back in the line-up in about 10 days.
